



WHAT'S NEXT?

Back in 2019, just before the world changed as we knew it, our congregation's leadership engaged in a process of strategic discernment to identify a handful of priorities that would help shape and strengthen our congregation in the coming years. This type of planning, we anticipated, would create our path for the next 3-5 years. Building on our vision, mission and core values, we identified three essential areas of growth: to **grow younger, grow deeper, and grow outward**. Within each of these mission imperatives we determined strategic priorities that would help us reach those goals. Four years later, I am pleased to share with you a progress report.

Grow Younger

While UCC has had some success in this area, we needed more focus on reaching young families, young adults and youth.

- We determined we needed a worship service that offers a Sunday morning alternative to traditional worship. Out of this was born our TEN:10 worship service, which launched in August of 2021. TEN:10 attendance this year is near capacity on many Sundays.

- We developed a more vibrant Sunday morning experience by revamping social media, prioritized high quality childcare, and preparing to update our facility through the Cornerstone Project to create a more welcoming environment, update children and youth spaces, provide added security, and help visitors more easily navigate our facility.

- We cast a new vision for Student Ministry that offers continuity in faith formation from middle-school through college.

Grow Deeper

A primary role of the church is to help people grow deeper in their faith journey. As this happens, members become more committed and connected. In 2019, participation in adult faith formation was low and mostly limited to Sunday mornings.

- To offer more ways to grow deeper, we launched our Circles of Faith ministry—a robust and intentional small group ministry for adults. This year we have had more than 270 people engaged in at least one Circle of Faith!
- Churches that are most alive and thriving are those that set high expectations from their members. We created a Discipleship Path to share with prospective members at our UCC & You seminars.
- We added a Member Engagement Coordinator to encourage members to connect and grow in their faith.

Grow Outward

While Outreach is one of UCC's hallmarks, the pandemic encouraged us to be more hands-on in our approach to local missions. Our hope was to develop a signature ministry linked to children's literacy, which Mayor Betsy Price identified as one of the greatest concerns of our community.

- Three years ago we connected with a new ministry partner, Academy 4, and committed to

provide a mentor for every 4th grade student at Alice Contreras Elementary School. This year we have more than 110 mentors and volunteers. We have expanded to offer Leader 5, which with the help of our volunteers, empowers the fifth graders we mentored last year to demonstrate their leadership skills by mentoring younger students.

As we give thanks for new momentum and new members and mark the incredible milestone of 150 years as The University's Church, it's time for us to think about what's next. I recently attended a church leadership conference in Kansas City in which Carey Nieuwhof, one of the most visionary church leaders around today, spoke on what he believes to be some of the important trends in the church over next 10 years. He suggested that in the next decade the churches that will thrive will place an even greater emphasis on digital ministry. Younger generations, he said, will want less performance and more presence; less production and more participation; less noise and more space; less personality and more humility; less head and more heart.


Nieuwhof also reminded us that churches that continually look back never move forward. So, over the next several months our ministry team and congregational leadership will prayerfully seek a new set of strategic priorities that allow us to build on the success of the last five years and continue to shape and strengthen University Christian Church in the coming days. I hope you will pray for these important conversations. I can't wait to share the results with you in the coming months.

I'm excited and invigorated about our future as we embark on the next 150 years of being church together, as we dare to dream big dreams, and partner with God to transform the world by living out Christ's courageous love.

GIFTS OF HOPE MINISTRIES PROGRAM DESCRIPTIONS 2023

Christmas Angels provides children with a holiday gift that builds confidence and encourages play.

The Children's Closet, a ministry of University Christian Church, provides new uniforms, clothing and school supplies to disadvantaged children in Fort Worth.

UCC Emergency Assistance Fund allows us to meet the needs of our neighbors, in the moment, by providing a meal, bus pass, gas card, groceries, utilities assistance, and more.

UCC's Page Scholarship awards partial college scholarships to seniors in Tarrant County.

Global Ministries, in mission in more than 90 countries and in covenant with more than 160 partner churches and ecumenical bodies around the world, is the joint global mission outreach effort of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) and the United Church of Christ.

Southwest Good Samaritan Ministries provides assistance and care to hundreds of people in need along the Texas Border, especially Central American political refugees, and individuals from other countries in political and economic turmoil.

Week of Compassion is the relief, refugee and development mission fund of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ).

Academy 4 is a mentoring program that equips communities and churches to build lasting relationships with schools and families. UCC partners with Alice Contreras Elementary School to support 4th, 1st, and 5th graders, and their families.

ACH Child and Family Services brings needed resources and skills to children and families struggling with life's challenges. Some programs keep families together, while others provide a healing home for children who can't live with their family.

DRC- Community Solutions to End Homelessness provides respectful, responsible, and effective community-based solutions to help individuals and families emerge from homelessness as productive, healthy people.

Fortress Youth Development Center provides hope and resources for children and their families through programs focused on academic, social-emotional, and spiritual support.

LGBTQ Saves provides a safe and brave space for social and personal development for LGBTQ youth and allies. Their mission is to create a community where all youth are safe.

Tarrant Area Food Bank empowers communities to eliminate hunger by providing food, education, and resources through innovation and collaboration.

Heifer International provides families with income-producing plants and animals and training in their care. HPI educates partners in community building and sustainable agriculture, providing daily nutrition and additional income for basic needs and education of children.


