

We celebrated our 150th year since our founding and began construction on a massive remodel project that will enable our facility to match the welcoming spirit of our congregation. But we also lost some seminal members of the church throughout the year, and experienced some collective tragedies that we're still all processing in our own way. At the same time, we brought 100+ new members into this faith journey and had some of our most-engaged sermon series of all-time. It was an impactful year.

As you receive this catalog at home or pick one up at church, Lent is beginning (a bit early this year) – and hopefully you're fully unplugged from the end of 2023 and thinking about the rest of 2024. "And God's People Sang... Amen"

arose out of a desire amongst the singers in the Chancel Choir to enhance Sunday morning worship services with a set of new choral responses to be sung following the Pastoral Prayer and Benediction each week. The choir deeply values the congregation's rich tradition of traditional worship music and seeks to keep the tradition alive by presenting fresh, updated musical offerings.

Realizing the numerous connections the choir has with professional musicians and composers, we decided to undertake this project of compiling new choral responses written especially for the UCC Chancel Choir. As some of these relationships were entirely professional and would

require financing, Dick Stinson spearheaded a fundraising effort. Members of the choir were so excited about the idea that they fully funded the project from within their ranks. The request for new responses yielded submissions from more than a dozen composers including six TCU alums, two emeritus TCU faculty, two members of the choir's bass section, several full-time professional composers, a current TCU faculty member, three members of UCC's music ministry staff, and friends. This new booklet includes 35 beautiful responses that will greatly enhance worship for years to come. Many thanks to these composers and all those that helped make this project possible.

On Maundy Thursday, March 28, at 6:30 pm, the Chancel Choir and Chamber Orchestra conducted by Rev. Dr. Todd Prickett, Minister of Music, will present Dan Forrest's "Requiem for the Living" in the UCC Sanctuary. Admission is Free.

REQUIEM FOR THE LIVING

A Requiem, at its core, is a prayer for rest-traditionally, for the deceased. The five movements of Dan Forrest's Requiem for the Living, (2013), however, form a narrative just as much for the living, and their own struggle with pain and sorrow, as for the dead. The opening movement sets the traditional Introit and Kyrie texts- pleas for rest and mercy- using ever-increasing elaborations on a simple three-note descending motive. The second movement, instead of the traditional Dies Irae, sets Scriptural texts that speak of the turmoil and sorrow which face humanity, while yet invoking musical and textual allusions to the Dies Irae. This movement juxtaposes aggressive rhythmic gestures with long, floating melodic lines, including quotes of the Kyrie

from the first movement. The Agnus Dei is performed next (a departure from the usual liturgical order) as a plea for deliverance and peace; the Sanctus, following it, becomes a response to this redemption. The Sanctus offers three different glimpses of the "heavens and earth, full of Thy glory", all of which develop the same musical motive: an ethereal opening section inspired by images of space from the Hubble Space Telescope, a stirring middle section inspired by images of our own planet as viewed from the International Space Station, and a closing section which brings the listener down to Earth, where cities teem with the energy of humanity. The Lux Aeterna which then closes the work portrays light, peace, and rest- for both the deceased and the living.

MEMBER ENGAGEMENT

In 2023, we welcomed almost 100 new members into the life of our church. Many of our new members share a similar experience on their journey to University Christian Church, that is, they begin by watching online before they ever attend in person. When they attend Church for the first time, they witness the hospitable nature of our congregation, and experience an authentic worship service, and perhaps encounter the Divine in a new way.

When these folks elect to attend our UCC and You class, those considering membership tell us how they love our core values and more importantly, how we as a church live out our values on a daily basis. They mention our core values are noticeable in our inclusive and compassionate relationships with each other and how we take our message of discipleship into the community with open mind and loving hearts. This is reinforced each Sunday when we recognize that the invitation to the Lord's table is not ours, but the Lords, and that ALL are welcome to the table.

they can be vulnerable. This allows everyone to support each other and walk together through difficult times. We remind them that as a congregation we are generous with our time, talent and offering when we respond to the needs of our community in our many outreach programs. Lastly, we recognize that none of us have all the answers. As a result of this, we allow for space to be curious, so we can discover God as we dive into scripture through our Sunday School classes, individual prayer and worship.

Through each of our members, (old and new) University Christian Church makes a visible commitment to care for each other as we live out Christ's courageous love in our services and our community.
